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Important Court Etiquettes

1).The Cone Zone.

If a court has a "Cone" placed on it, that court must not be used. It may have been recently groomed, may be reserved for an upcoming event or game or may simply be "soft" and is waiting to dry out. Please respect the "Cone Zone"





2).Grooming.

If you find it necessary to groom the court prior to your match, all activity must be completed 30 minutes before your games commence. See Rule II (H) of the 2013 rules.

Therefore, if your first game starts at 6.30pm all grooming must end at 6pm. For a 5.00pm start, everything must be completed by 4.30pm.

3). Bouncing of Balls on Concrete Court Surround.

In the past, some members have been seen to "Bounce" the bocce ball on the concrete edge of the court to remove grit and oyster shell. This practice must be discontinued as it not only may weaken the integrity of the ball but also will eventually crack the court's concrete walls, which will lead to costly repairs.







Please put markers at the top of the board, as shown, when returning them to the clubhouse.









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
